

## Liturgy Reflection

Reconciliation is a powerful act. It takes a bond that has been broken and makes it whole again. It restores the unity of a relationship, of a family. Today's Gospel - the parable of the prodigal son - is a beautiful example of reconciliation. The younger son broke his bond with his

father and the unity of his family. When he returned home after dissipating his money, his morals, and his dignity, he thought that that bond was too broken for reconciliation. But his father, in welcoming him back without judging him, without even asking what had happened, restored the bond. They were whole again. In the first reading, God reconciled with the Israelites, restoring them to their native land - the promised land - which once again could provide them sustenance and freedom. Then we hear Saint Paul tell us that God and the world are reconciled through Christ, restoring the relationship that had been broken repeatedly through sin. The example of the prodigal son's father gives us hope, hope that no matter how broken our relationship, it is always able to be made whole again.




## HOLY FATHER'S PRAYER INTENTIONS

*Promote in your community a moment of prayer for persecuted Christian communities and reflect together on the current conditions that oppose living out human and Christian values.*



## Passages

The point of today's first reading is fulfillment. The forty-year trek of the Israelites is over; they now camp in the Promised Land and celebrate the Passover. The manna that has sustained them in the desert ends; from now on they will eat of the produce of the land. Our Eucharist - the manna of our journey - will end when we enter heaven. Paul, in the second reading, speaks of change. The old order has passed away: all is new. Reconciliation has been secured in Christ. The message has to be proclaimed everywhere by the ambassadors for Christ. The beautiful parable of the prodigal son is given to us by Christ in answer to the criticism of the Pharisees, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." Jesus tells the story not to illustrate some vague human ideal of being broadminded or tolerant. He wants us to identify the father with God - a God who reaches out across rules, regulations, and even common sense to embrace and to forgive.

## A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

Last weekend's activities had a bunch of our city staff (especially the GBPD) working overtime as the arts festival occupied the school parking lots, plus the carnival was in full swing, along with lacrosse and softball tournaments. Throw all that together and you can see why we had to employ extra security just to keep the St. Ann parking lot open for our parishioners. For those Vigil Mass attendees who were a bit inconvenienced and had to enter the lot from the Daniel Street side only, we at least were able to fit everybody in and only had to contend with a few "attitudes". The Knights were also busy as they entered the gumbo cook-off competition at Shoreline Park. Lots of opportunity to meet and mingle with all the local folks as well as out of town visitors. I have to admit I felt for the folks at DQ. I passed by there a couple times and their parking lot was full but they had very few customers inside. Publix probably also was affected. These were all good things to happen in our town, but maybe next year we could spread them out a bit.

You may have been listening when we discussed the "Rename the 3 mile Bridge" project. There are those who want to name the new bridge after General Chappie James (first African American 4 star general). Others say it's not a new bridge - it's a replacement bridge - and should keep the name that's on it (Beall - long time ago state senator). There are others with other ideas plus there are many who don't really care - it's still going to be the 3 mile bridge. Senator Broxson wants the four local entities (Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties and Pensacola and Gulf Breeze) to come to an agreement before he takes it to Tallahassee. Santa Rosa County and Pensacola have already decided (not that they asked anybody), so Escambia County and Gulf Breeze have formed a group of delegates to "ask the people". There are nine delegates - 5 from Escambia and four from Gulf Breeze. Each council member was allowed to choose a representative - the mayor sat out on this one - and Councilman Hebert chose Our Lady parishioner Vic Bindi, Jr. while Mayor Pro Tem Naile chose St. Ann parishioner and Parish Finance Council member Tim Burr. So - if you happen to see these guys in the neighborhood and you have an opinion on this subject - let 'em have it. It should be noted that input is solicited/accepted from all in the 32561 and 32563 zips.

The Blues Angels folks were on campus this past week installing a new A/V system in the parish hall. When completed that should finish the renew/renovate project for the hall.

Scholarship - I mentioned in previous print that we have on occasion a Discovery School teacher who also has a child enrolled in the school. For young single parents it can take quite a chunk out of their income and they have a tough go of it. Our Scholarship Fund is at or near zero, and we do have a need. If you feel you could help a bit, checks (or on-line) may be directed to St. Ann (Scholarship Fund) and would be tax deductible. We are able to give employee discounts, but those are now limited due to tax implications. The need is for about \$6,000 per year, and we have an anonymous donor who is willing to "prime the pump" for the first \$1,000.

### HEALTH TIPS BY NICOLLE

As discussed last week, uncontrolled high blood pressure (hypertension) can have negative, long-term effects on your body and put you at risk for heart attack, heart failure and stroke. It's known as the "silent killer" because critical damage could be occurring to your heart without you knowing it.



Work with your healthcare provider, as you may need to take medications to help lower your blood pressure. In addition to medications, the following are ways you can help fight the "silent killer":

1. Eat a heart healthy (low fat, low cholesterol, low sodium) diet. Eat plenty of fruits and vegetables and drink plenty of water.
2. Limit alcohol consumption
3. Exercise regularly (if you are not currently exercising, be sure to discuss starting a new exercise routine with your healthcare provider).
4. QUIT smoking - this is a big one! Talk to your healthcare provider about ways you can kick the habit.
5. Manage stress. Exercising is a great way to do this
6. Watch your weight - following a heart healthy diet and exercise will help.
7. See your healthcare provider regularly, be sure to tell them about ALL medications you are taking, including herbal teas/supplements, over-the-counter medications and anything you take every once in a while or as needed).
8. Take all prescribed medications as directed, taking care to read the warning labels (for example: "Take with food" or "May cause drowsiness"). Do not let your medications run out, as stopping some medications suddenly can be dangerous. Take advantage of the auto-fill program at your pharmacy.




