



Liturgy Reflection

Today's readings are quite dramatic, one featuring religious authorities who opposed the apostles Paul and Barnabas "with violent abuse," another highlighting a crowd of people who had lived through the persecution of the early church. However, the lasting impression in each of the readings is one of tender comfort and hopeful reassurance. The church of the

first century thrived with intense growth but also met with frequent persecution. As Christianity broke away from Judaism, both religious and state authorities targeted proselytizers of the new faith. Paul and Barnabas felt the wrath of the authorities and were expelled from Antioch in Pisidia. Yet as this passage ends they and the early Christians "were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit." They were not filled with anger and resentment, or even fear and despair, but with hope and joy, for they knew God was with them. The Roman state offered no religious liberty to its subjects. Christians could be killed for rejecting the pagan faith of the Romans. Yet they were assured in their faith that "God (would) wipe away every tear from their eyes", for Jesus said, "I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish."

The Good Shepherd

The Good Shepherd not only knows us but has given his life for us. We belong to the Shepherd. His life is the source of our life. One part of this relationship is firm - God's part. The Father has entrusted us to the Son, and the Son will not let go of our hand. The other part of this relationship depends on us, of course. In today's Gospel, Jesus assumes our open-hearted good will. "My sheep hear my voice ... and they follow me." This hearing and following is a daily undertaking that implies responsibility. Take Paul and Barnabas, for example. They moved ever closer to the reality that salvation was also meant for those members of the flock who did not yet know God's saving power. The Gentiles were the sheep known by the Shepherd. Paul could finally see that now was the acceptable time for them to know the Shepherd. Now the circle could be completed. Finally, those who were known and loved by the God of Jesus could know and follow the God of Jesus. There will never be a last chapter to this story of salvation.

A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

"It's better to be interested than interesting", as said by Quint Studer in his weekly column in the PNJ. He's basically saying when we come across as interested in others rather than trying to be interesting to them, there's a better chance they'll like us and trust us (and maybe do business with us.) Makes sense. Something to work on for sure – especially if you work with the public.

Meeting last week with Northcliffe – There was a neighborhood meeting last week for the residents of the Northcliffe area that could be affected by the prospective building of the Holiday Inn Express between the WalMart Market and the baseball/ softball fields. City officials showed renderings of the current site plan and also proposed re-siting the property to move the building as far from the residential area as possible. Other streets to be directly affected are Windsor Place, Kenilworth and Andrew Jackson Trail. Although putting in a large building and parking lot concerned the 50 or so residents who attended, the main question keeps coming back to "traffic". To alleviate some of the anticipated crowding, the city could be interested in acquiring the .7 acres next to the Regions Bank to offer up as overflow parking during sports events.

The "Committee to Name the Bridge" has had its first meeting. Remember – Escambia County Commissioners and City of Gulf Breeze have set up a joint project for naming the new bridge. Santa Rosa County Commissioners and City of Pensacola have already cast their votes. The first good move the committee made was to name parishioner, Tim Burr, as Chairman – which will ensure fair, orderly and efficient meetings. The committee will conduct town hall meetings this summer and take input from all.

First communion was celebrated last week for 36 St. Ann kids and this weekend for 8 Our Lady of the Assumption candidates. This is the result of much hard work by the Faith Formation staff and numerous volunteers A really good job!!



HEALTH TIPS BY NICOLLE

Here are a few tips from the American Cancer Society on what to look for in a sunscreen **Choose a sunscreen with "broad spectrum" protection.** Sunscreens with this label protect against both UVA and UVB rays. All sunscreen products protect against UVB rays, which are the main cause of sunburn and skin cancers, but UVA rays also contribute to skin cancer and



premature aging. Only products that pass a certain test can be labeled "broad spectrum." Products that aren't broad spectrum must carry a warning that they only protect against sunburn, not skin cancer or skin aging. Make sure your sunscreen has a sun protection factor (SPF) 30 or higher. The SPF number is the level of protection the sunscreen provides against UVB rays. Higher SPF numbers do mean more protection, but the higher you go, the smaller the difference becomes. SPF 15 sunscreens filter out about 93% of UVB rays, while SPF 30 sunscreens filter out about 97%, SPF 50 sunscreens about 98%, and SPF 100 about 99%. No sunscreen protects you completely. The FDA requires any sunscreen with SPF below 15 to carry a warning that it only protects against sunburn, not skin cancer or skin aging. "Water resistant" does not mean "waterproof." No sunscreens are waterproof or "sweatproof," and manufacturers are not allowed to claim that they are. If a product's front label makes claims of being water resistant, it must specify whether it lasts for 40 minutes or 80 minutes while swimming or sweating.

For best results, reapply sunscreen at least every 2 hours and even more often if you are swimming or sweating. Sunscreen usually rubs off when you towel yourself dry, so you will need to put more on.
