

Liturgy Reflection

The great division of the early church, which St. Paul often addressed in his letters, was the division between Jews and Gentiles, or, more accurately, between Christians with a Jewish background and Christians outside the Jewish tradition. Paul, formerly Jewish, now Christian and a missionary to the Gentiles, preached that Jesus “broke down the dividing wall”. Through the cross, “you who were far off” (Gentiles) and “those who were near” (Jews) have become one, the church, one body of Christ. Jesus unites what had been divided. Jeremiah had prophesied that God would gather the people from where they were separated in exile and raise up a shepherd to reign over them. Mark describes the vast crowd on the shore as “sheep without a shepherd”, which moves Jesus with pity. This pity impels Jesus to be that shepherd. Jesus did not divide the crown into Jew and Gentile. In his name, we continue to try to break down the walls that divide - between culture or class or race or gender, between anything that separates us from each other - to become one, one body in Christ.

Christ's Presence in the World

There's a bit of a “missing link” in the first two sentences of today's Gospel from Mark. In the first, the apostles return from having been sent out on mission two by two. Their instructions were to preach repentance, drive out demons, and heal the sick in Jesus' name. In the second sentence, Jesus tells them to come away with him and rest a while. It would be nice for us to imagine that, between those two sentences, a look of amazed gratitude and pleasure crossed the face of Jesus as he hears of the kingdom proclaimed in his name, and how they didn't have to shake the dust off their feet anywhere. They deserved a rest! It might not be bad for us, when we gather together with Jesus as the apostles do today, to do this kind of debriefing, allowing the Lord to hear what we've sought to do in his name, our successes, our failures, our need to get away with him for a while to be fortified for further work in God's name. For we, the baptized, are not only the flock of Jesus Christ; through water and the power of the Spirit we have also become the Body of Christ, the presence of the Shepherd for the life of the world.


HOLY FATHER'S PRAYER INTENTIONS

A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

CSA numbers through June: Our Lady – Pledge goal - \$32,391; Total Pledge - \$38,901; Cash received: \$32,711 - \$320 short of goal with 73 families pledging. St. Ann – Pledge goal - \$140,093; Total Pledge - \$190,117; Cash received: \$151,042 - \$10,949 over goal with 307 families pledging. We're in pretty good shape with 6 months to go but not quite as good as last year. Overall the diocese is on track for making its goal.

In the obit for Bill Balch the family requested in lieu of flowers that donations be made to the St. Ann Food Bank in Bill's name. That amount has now topped \$3,400. Bill would be proud.

A couple of events for your calendar: The Feast of Sts. Joachim and Ann - Mary's parents and grandparents of the Lord - July 26th. This day becomes a liturgical Solemnity in our parish. Mass will be celebrated at St. Ann on July 26th at 5:30 PM, followed by a casual dinner in the parish hall. If you're planning to stay for dinner, please call us here at the office so we can tell the cooks. This will become an annual service.

While you're circling dates on your calendar, don't forget August 15th at Our Lady of the Assumption. In addition to the annual "Feast Day of the Assumption" led by Bishop Bill, we will have the bishop dedicate the new expansion of the parish hall followed by dinner of course. Our contractors, Vision Construction, working under the watchful eyes of Lynn and Kim, assure us the facility will be "move-in" ready. We hope to have the classrooms furnished and ready for the Sunday School classes to start in August. You can help by chipping in on the furnishings. The building contract doesn't cover any of the furnishings, so we're hoping to find generous parishioners and visitors alike who will make substantial donations (such as "buying" a classroom with the buyers name on it) to contributing to the all-purpose conference/meeting room. Give us a call and we'll speak about particulars. We're also looking into selling bricks as a continuing way to pay for the expansion.

You probably didn't notice - because it wasn't very noticeable - but we just finished replacing the corner glass on Nickelsen Hall. The corners and one side of the hall were doors at one time but have been put out of usage by various renovations over the years. Rust, caulking and erosion were prevalent. It's part of the plan to "redo" the hall, and we'll give you more details as we get closer to start time.

According to the PNJ, Pensacola's Intendencia Street will have the first "woonerf" in the city. Woonerf is a Dutch word that translates to "living street" and has become the term used in urban planning to describe a street that brings cars and pedestrians safely together without traditional traffic control devices. It's a traffic calming plan that narrows streets and also puts plants in the middle of streets to slow traffic down to 5 mph. Maybe we should consider that for some of our local drivers who consider our drive-thru to be a speedway.

Speaking of the PNJ - they must be using the Garcon Point Bridge marketing method - if quality and readership declines - raise the prices. We were just notified that the new rate will be \$70 per month starting August 1st.




CHILDREN'S LITURGY

HEALTH TIPS BY MELISSA

Adopting prudent lifestyle habits and eating a healthy diet are the best ways to achieve optimal health. You can help minimize risks of heart disease and promote a strong cardiovascular system by adding these anti-inflammatory foods to your diet: **1. Nuts** - especially almonds, walnuts, pistachios, cashews and macadamias contain heart-healthy monounsaturated fat. Eat a moderate portion of preferably raw or gently toasted nuts every day. **2. Whole soy protein** - if you substitute whole soy protein, such as edamame or tofu, for animal protein each day, you can lower levels of homocysteine, a toxic amino acid linked to increased risk of heart disease. If these levels remain elevated, seek out an integrative provider and discuss how targeted B vitamin supplementation may help. **3. Fresh garlic** - this medicinal herb may help lower cholesterol levels. Use one or two chopped raw or lightly cooked cloves a day. **4. Green tea** - it provides EGCG, a polyphenol that may help to moderate inflammation and lower cholesterol. Substitute a cup of heart-healthy green tea for your morning coffee or afternoon soda. **5. Soluble fiber** - it has a powerful cholesterol-lowering effect. Beans and legumes are good sources to add to your diet - aim for one or two servings per day.
