

## Liturgy Reflection

It is not easy to be a Christian. That is, it is difficult to be a true Christian. Isaiah gives us a foretaste of this when he writes: "I give my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard." Isaiah suffers as Christ would, and like Christ he suffers willingly. For God's

sake, he stands up to those who oppose him without fighting back. James does not speak of suffering, but he tells us that faith demands action. "Faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead." Dead. It is not enough just to believe. If our neighbor is in need and we do not respond, what good is our faith? The Gospel puts it all together. Jesus tells his disciples what it means to be a Christian. After telling them that he must suffer, die, and rise on the third day, he rebukes a protesting Peter: "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Then he addresses his disciples and the assembled crowd, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." This, then, is what we need to do. This is what our faith demands.

## Servant

Sometimes the hour and the person meet. Sometimes, when a task or mission is set upon our shoulders, we know we must meet our responsibilities and we are ready. These are heady and invigorating times. The first reading and the Gospel proclamation today are intimate glimpses of a commencement, an inauguration of a challenging future. In both readings, a sense of gravity prevails. The first reading is from the mysterious Servant Songs from the book of Isaiah. The person is steadfast and brave. His courage and bravery are not located in his stout heart, but in God. We are reminded, "The Lord God opens my ear that I may hear", so the servant understands the mission. And twice, "The Lord God is my help", so that the servant can endure the coming struggle.

Carol has served in all the positions, including director of the school, but her first love was and is the two year olds in the Monkey Room. Speaking of the school, we wish a speedy recovery and offer prayers for teacher Ms. Ashley who was in a serious auto accident and is recovering at Sacred Heart Hospital.

New Hilton Property – Looks as if another hotel will be added to the local skyline – good for taxes and employment – maybe bad for traffic and storm water runoff. With the Home 2 Suites passing the Architectural Review Board, they've cleared one hurdle. The extended stay concept will be 109 rooms and will be located on the property between Rotollos and 98. That also borders on McClure I think.

Another property being looked at, fairly low on the horizon for now, is the lots on the south and eastern side of the Walmart complex. Holiday Inn Express has expressed interest in developing that site for a 103 room hotel. (Interestingly – several years ago while the city was working to get certain areas re-zoned from commercial to mixed use, that property was taken off the agenda due to fierce opposition from local residents. That re-zoning was what led the way for The Arbors to be built.

There would also possibly be a potential restaurant on that lot. Both properties will be getting a fair amount of coverage as they get closer to development. Local zoning would indicate probably a 4-floor capacity for the Home 2 Suites while the HI Express area property would likely be 3 floors. We'll be seeing lots of discussion as we progress.

Another "taken for granted" area we should thank more often – those families who volunteer to pick up the daily baked goods at Panera 3 nights per week. The Fulford and Federovich families handle the lion's share of the tasks, and they have some backup from a few others who haven't yet given me permission to use their names. Thanks so much – it's really a big help for us.

It's noted that the issues with cracks in the new bridge won't go away. The Navarre Press has been keeping up a steady drum-beat on this subject with opinions ranging from "no problem" to "big problem". We could probably get closer to the truth if that \$15 million bonus was removed.

Truism: "Never tell your problems to anyone, because 20 per cent don't care and the other 80 per cent are glad you have them."



## WHAT ARE EMBER DAYS?

Bishop Bill mentioned Ember Days in his recent letter to us. They are special days aligned with each of the four seasons of the year: winter, spring, summer and fall. Each season focuses on a crop



that is harvested during that time and used in the Church's liturgy and sacraments. Ember Days are always on a Wednesday (the day Judas chose to betray Jesus), Friday (Jesus' crucifixion) and Saturday (when Jesus' body lay in the tomb). Traditionally the Wednesdays and Saturdays are days of fasting, with the Fridays being days of both fasting and abstinence from meat. However, this hasn't been obligatory since 1966. Fall's crop is grapes, crushed to make wine which becomes the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist. The fall Ember Days follow the Exaltation of the Holy Cross (September 14).
