

## Liturgy Reflection

The phenomenon of the Holy Trinity is perhaps the deepest mystery of our faith. One God, but three persons? Limited by human concepts, we can only attempt to understand the mystery. God is truly one, but God is not solitary. God is in relationship, and always has been. The intimate relationship of Father and Son and Spirit is an essential part of the identity of God. The reading from Deuteronomy alludes to another triple relationship: that of God, the Chosen People, and the Promised Land. Moses reminds the people of God's awesome deeds, done specifically for the people God chose. Paul makes the connection that if we are sisters and brothers in Christ, we are then also children of God. We have received a "Spirit of adoption", the Holy Spirit bearing witness to our relationship with God. Then in Matthew we have the clearest expression of the Trinity, in Jesus' instructions to baptize "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit". Since the Spirit comes upon us in baptism and stays with us, Jesus is able to reassure the apostles (and us), "I am with you always".

## The Trinity is Love

Theologians throughout the Christian centuries have spilled much ink (and, on occasion, some blood) in describing and defining the mystery of the Holy Trinity. One of the earliest, most poetic, and beautiful descriptions comes from St. Augustine in De Trinitas, wherein he describes the Trinity as One (the Father) who loves, One (the Son) who is loved, and One (the Spirit) who is love. And these three Ones are also one Three. It might be wisest for us to leave the technical wranglings to the academic theologians, and focus on the fact that the three Persons of the Trinity are indeed persons; they are best known and understood in their love for each other and for us. We are made in the image of those loving persons, and our best relationships are lived out in the context of love. Truly loving relationships are inexhaustible mysteries to be lived in joy. If this is true of our human relationships, how much more so is it true of our relationship with the Trinity. And how much more does it call upon us to be joyful, loving witnesses of the holy mystery of the One-in-Three. This is the mystery to which we were called when we were chosen to be God's own, baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity.

# A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

CSA numbers through mid-May: Both churches have exceeded their pledge goal, although neither has made goal as far as cash receipts. That's not unusual since most of our contributors are set up on a payment plan. Dollar-wise, we're lagging well behind our 2017 numbers, although the percentage of participation is almost identical to last year (38% for Our Lady and 35% for St. Ann). We hesitate to budget for the CSA over-goal because it's not predictable and only reflects about one-third of our parish population. When we do exceed goal we consider it a windfall and it goes directly to primary savings. Usually when CSA is down, offertory may be up and vice versa. This year offertory is down \$58,000 for St. Ann and \$22,000 for Our Lady. (Note the numbers below.) Since attendance is also trending downward, it's important that we increase our on-line giving so that, to put it commercially, your money gets here whether you do or not. Currently St. Ann is at 37.0% and Our Lady 18% on on-line giving. I know you hate talking about money, so let's move on.

Last weekend we had the annual St. Ann 5K Run/Walk, and to say it was a success would be an understatement. David Taveirne hit a home run on this one, almost single-handedly putting it together and then recruiting more than 50 volunteers for race day (although it's evident that David's family put in lots of hard work as well.) We had 314 runners/walkers and maybe that many who just came for the festivities. According to Msgr, it was the first time a bishop has run in any diocese race as Bishop Bill led off the race as #1. No official numbers yet, but several missions/charities benefitted from the race. Trivia question: "Which one of the 3 Naile family participants did not win a medal?" You probably guessed that one pretty quickly.

Hot on the heels of the 5K was the 43<sup>rd</sup> Annual Optimist Fishing Rodeo, which also scored very high on the "best ever" list and produced a record number of fish weighed in (and eaten). No numbers yet, but it was a great event and St. Ann is a yearly corporate sponsor. As is the case with the 5K, the Optimist (and Sertoma) rodeos are popular due to their family orientation. Of note is the fact that for the 15<sup>th</sup> year in a row, a Baltz family member was a winner - Thomas John in this case.

Take a look at the new picnic tables on the parish hall patio, courtesy of Eagle Scout and parishioner, Daniel Combes. Good job, most appreciated and congratulations to the Combes family on their new "Eagle".

Dairy Queen - The opening of the new DQ slipped a bit, but I'm told that it will open for sure on May 28 - although that is Memorial Day.

The Gulf Breeze City Council continues to tweak the golf cart ordinance as it moves through the process of readings prior to final approval. At the May 21<sup>st</sup> meeting a few items were changed, some clarifications were made, input was received from the residents during Public Hearing and it appears the ordinance will pass a 2<sup>nd</sup> and final reading on June 4. Briefly, the ordinance will require that golf carts be registered with the city annually, drivers will be at least 14 years of age, stay off the sidewalks and designated streets with speed limits of more than 25 MPH (Fairpoint, Shoreline, Hwy 98, Hwy 399, South Sunset and Daniel). You may cross these streets (except 98 and 399) to get to connecting streets (i.e Highpoint, across Fairpoint, to Navarre). The overpass is also closed to golf carts. There will also be some limitations on parking at Shoreline Park.
