

Liturgy Reflection

Once again, Jesus challenges his disciples to change their perspective. He had just told them - for the third time - that he would soon be put to death. In Mark's Gospel, James and John immediately make a request to have special places in God's kingdom when

Jesus rises in glory. How inappropriate! Jesus tries to make them understand how difficult his mission is, then goes on to give a lesson on true leadership: "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant." Whereas world leaders lord their authority over others, Jesus announces, "The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." The author of the passage of Isaiah we hear today also tried to change the perspective of his audience. The Israelites had been defeated and sent into exile. Truly their lives were difficult, but Isaiah finds this suffering to be redemptive: "through his suffering, my servant shall justify many." Though "tested in every way", both Jesus and Isaiah were willing to sacrifice themselves on behalf of others.

God's Work of Salvation

God's work of salvation is the focus of this weekend's readings. From the prophetic event of Isaiah to Jesus' understanding of the human condition in Hebrews, concluding with Jesus paying our ransom in Mark, God is in control. There may be failings and misunderstandings along the way. We may move away from God, but at our conversion, God leads us back. Like James and John, we may let greed and power blur our vision of what Jesus wants us to know about the Kingdom; but tirelessly we are taught and re-taught what life in the Kingdom will be. Jesus has paid our ransom to ensure that we will share in the Kingdom. It is not unusual to think of Jesus' ransom as a punishment that he endured. However, it is more accurate, and more like Jesus, for us to recognize ransom as God's gift to us.



A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

An explanation: Last week when storms were coming and internets were down I realized I hadn't prepared a column so, in order to not hold up production, I inserted an old article, which is one of my favorites, eulogizing my late friend Jim Cibula. What I neglected to do was to insert the disclaimer that this was a re-print of a 5 year old article. My apologies for the miscommunication, but I hope you enjoyed the write-up.

We had Oneblood at St. Ann last Sunday on short notice and had good response to the high demand in Panama City. We had 24 donors and they were able to provide 19 units. I think that means we were able to help 57 people. Good job! We may have them back again before the holidays, about December 9th I think.

We have submitted our furniture order for the new education/conference center and it should be here in 3-4 weeks. We think you'll like the choices made by the Our Lady Parish Council. Most of the outfitting is done or on order, and we're working on the naming of the building and rooms. The Sunday schoolers are enjoying their new classrooms. Your donations and pledges have enabled you to furnish this space without going into further debt. In case you're counting you have sold 29 bricks thus far, and we'll be looking for some help "paving" the way when the engraving is done and the bricks are delivered back to us.

Looking through a recent article from the PNJ business section (where I ALWAYS read the Quint Studer column then bring it to work) I noted a reference to "ghosting" which is not a part of the Halloween season. In this case it refers to a new trend – people simply not showing up for work, quitting with no communication at all– with no prior or follow-on explanation. There was mention of one employee who went to the extreme of having a co-worker announce that he had died. We see some evidence of that here when people apply for jobs and then don't show up for the interview or, accept a job and then never show up for work. We believe some of that behavior is tied to people who are drawing unemployment and this is their way of showing they're attempting to find a job. I suppose ghosting could be used to describe those who are assigned a certain volunteer task and never show up.

Another column (Atlanta Journal Constitution) brought to my attention was entitled "How religion fits into retirement happiness" and referred to a survey of retired folks who found that, if you want to be happy, a little religion is good, but more is better – up to a point. How's that for a wishy-washy answer? What it means, according to the survey, is that if you attend church at least once a week, you're 1 ½ times more likely to be happy than non-attenders. Christmas and Easter attendees are 50% more likely to be unhappy. Once respondents jumped to the "multiple times per week" category, happiness tailed off a bit. Interesting – since we have a whole bunch of folks here at St. Ann who attend Mass six days a week.



HEALTH TIPS BY NICOLLE

So often I hear people say that they are sick, and their primary care provider "won't" give them antibiotics. Antibiotics are helpful, in some illnesses, but not in others. Here are some helpful tips from the CDC on when antibiotics are needed and when they are not. . . .

Say YES to antibiotics when needed for certain infections caused by bacteria. Say NO to antibiotics for viruses, such as colds and flu, or runny noses, even if the mucus is thick, yellow or green.

Antibiotics also won't help for some common bacterial infections, including most cases of bronchitis, many sinus infections, and some ear infections. When they're not needed, antibiotics won't help you, and the side effects could still hurt you. Never pressure your healthcare professional to prescribe an antibiotic. 30% of antibiotics are prescribed unnecessarily in doctors' offices and emergency departments in the United States.

Know What's Got You Sick

Antibiotics cure bacterial infections, but not viral infections such as:

- Colds or flu
- Most coughs and bronchitis
- Most sore throats
- Runny noses



Taking antibiotics for viral infections:

- Will not cure the infection
- Will not keep other people from getting sick
- Will not make you feel better
